History



- First attempts in 1957
- 1963 Purchasing of 4 dogs by the Alpine Club South Tyrol ACS
- Marius Eccli became the first group leader of the avalanche search dog handlers
- 1979, the first winter rescue course was held at Plan de Corones
- 1979 in autumn the department of avalanche search dog handlers was founded in the ACS
- May 1999 we organized the IKAR conference in Pfitsch
- Since 2020 Unterweger Manfred leads the group of the search dog handlers

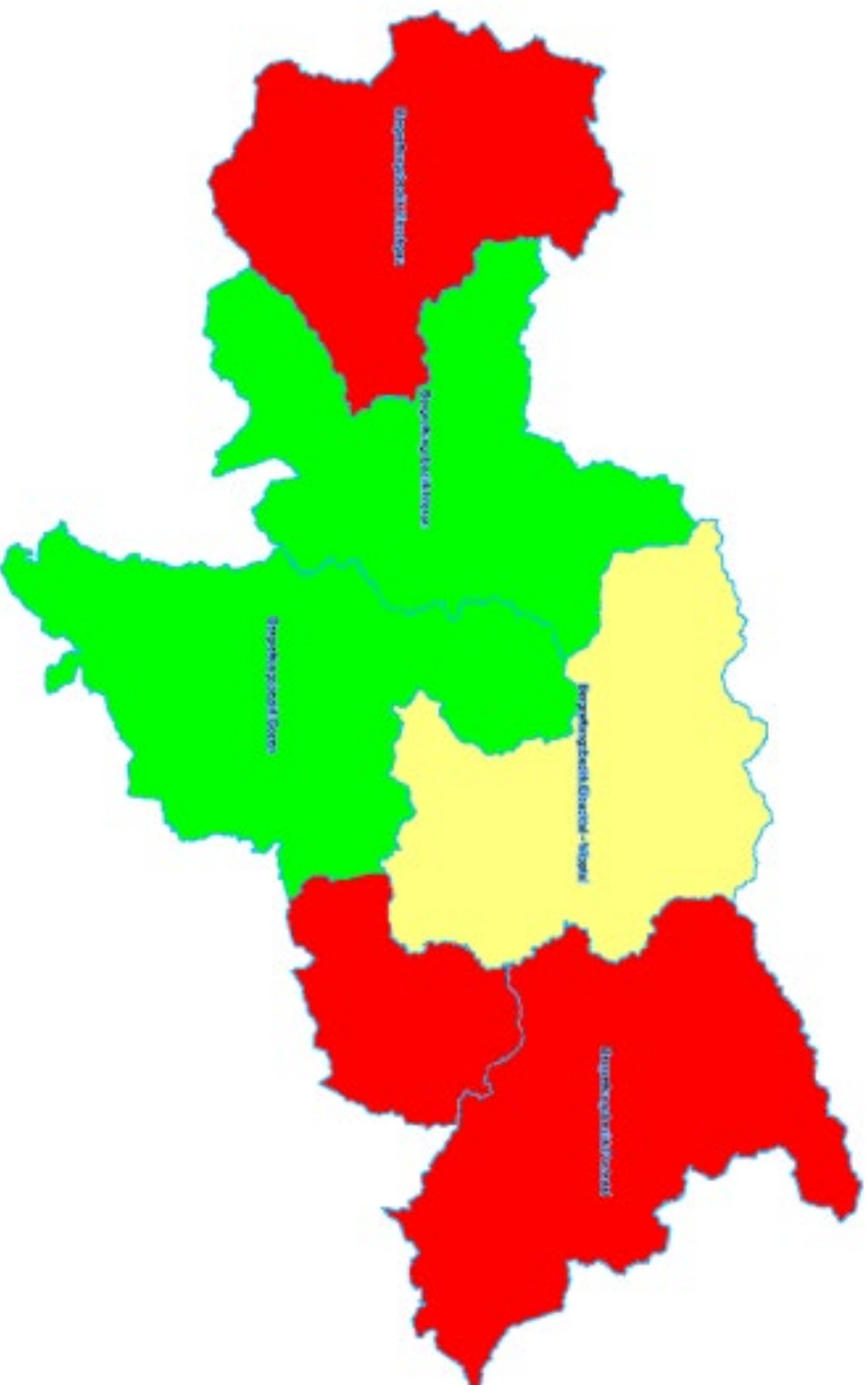
Organisation in South Tyrol

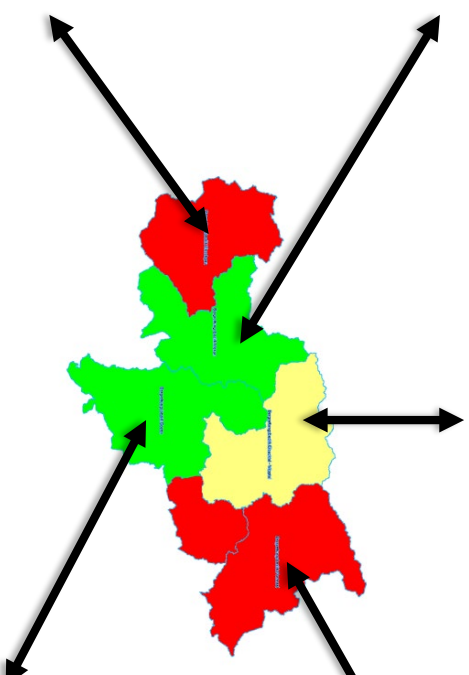

The alerting – The priority codes

The alerting of the mountain rescue stations is done centrally by the provincial emergency call center



- 4A - Departure of material: avalanche (or mudslide) with confirmed information that people are buried
- 4B - Material releases: avalanche (or mudslide) with uncertain information whether people are buried or involved.
- trained mountain rescue members only!



- 5 - Search operation in the alpine terrain (trained mountain rescue members only!)
- 6A - Search operation in non-alpine terrain
- 6B - Clarification search operation in non-alpine terrain



The Alerting – Notification with Pager

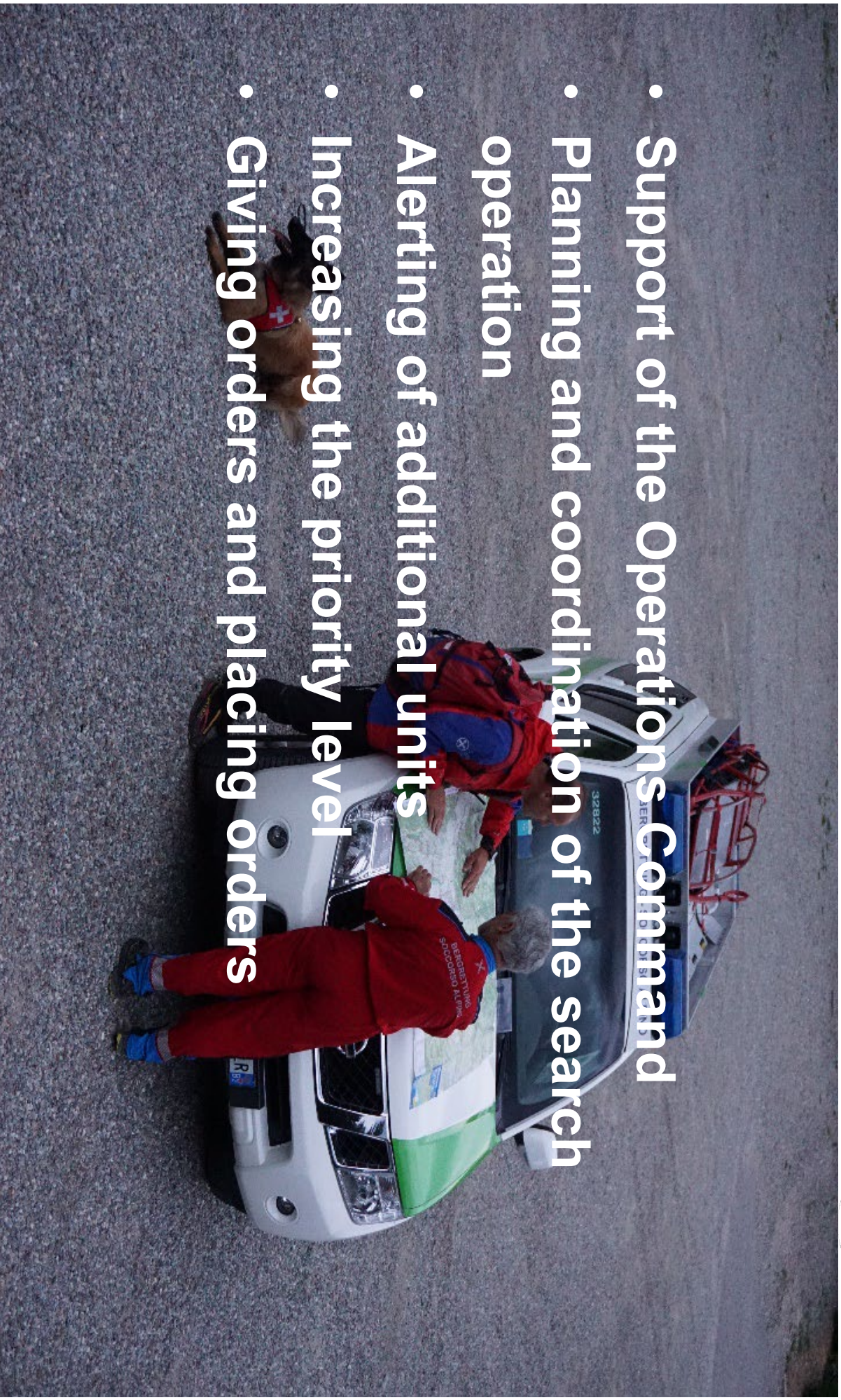
- Short message information about the Mountain rescue operation
- who set the alarm
- The priority Code of the rescue operation
- The location of the rescue operation
- brief description of the operation





Dog Coordinator

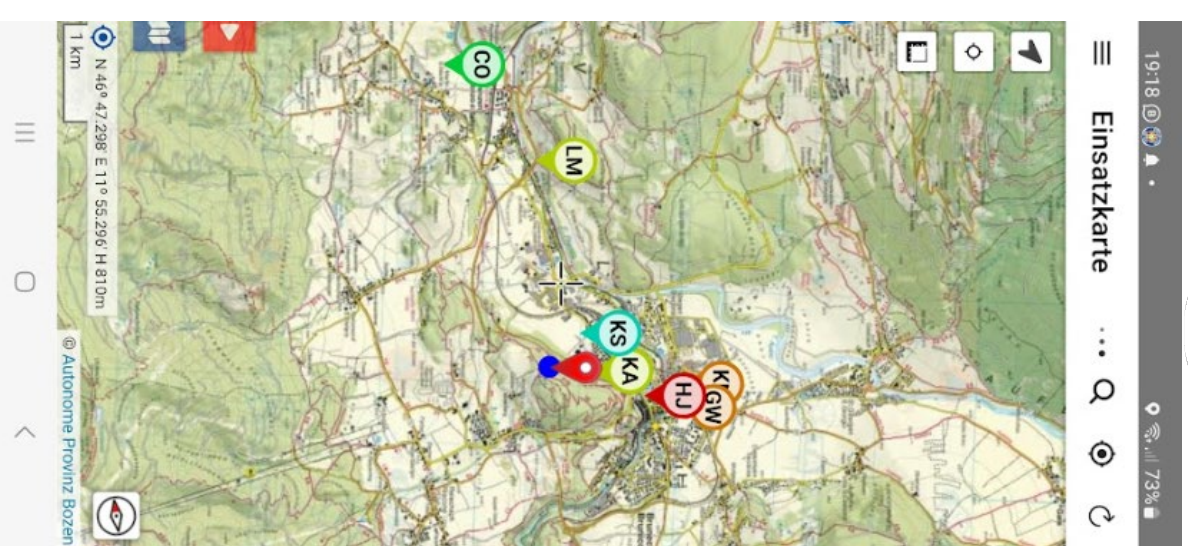
- Support of the Operations Command
- Planning and coordination of the search operation
- Alerting of additional units
- Increasing the priority level
- Giving orders and placing orders





TOOLS – BRD APP

- Can be installed on the private Smartphone from the Dog handler
- Possibility to join to the rescue operation or not
- Live stream from the exact position of the Participant in the rescue operation
- Possibility to contact each participant by phone
- Possibility to send short messages, images
- Track recordings
- To transmit GPS coordinates
- To set logistic GPS points





Device – Tool Garmin Atmos 100/K5

- Map deposited
- Precise indication of the position of the dog and handler
- Possibility of recording the track
- Storage and transfer the tracks in the Deployment Office program





Device - Tool

- The Special Vehicle Technology (SF-Technik)
- has been specially designed to support search operations
- long-term operations and on-call or precautionary services





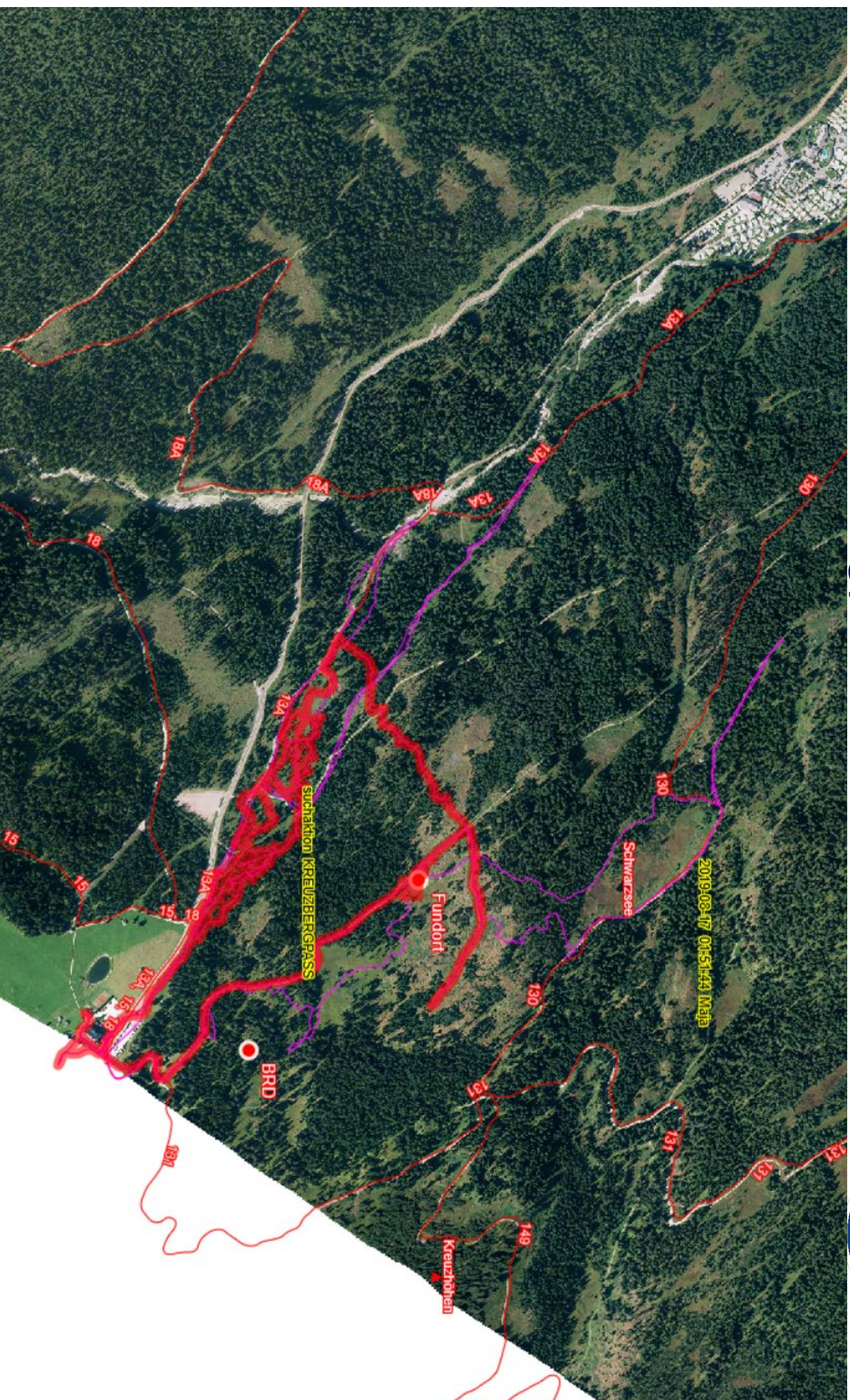
Kreuzbergpass – 19.08.2019

- A search operation launched on Saturday night at the Kreuzberg Pass near Sesto
- Shortly before 2 a.m., the dogs finally guided the rescuers into a dense undergrowth
- An 86-year-old holidaymaker was found dead in the forest
- Search dog Ronja found the lifeless person.
