# Avalanche accident in France 2014 – 2015




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## One of the « worst » year since 1980


- 134 people caught
- 29 fatal accidents (10 years average = 22)
- 45 fatalities (10 years average = 32)

- 25 skitourers
- 10 off piste skiers or snowboarders
- 8 mountaineers
- 2 other activities



## Some explanations to these « bad » figures ? We had:


✓ homogeneous weak layers in the snowpack on large uncommon surface (at least uncommon for the recreationnists and their representation of danger)
