

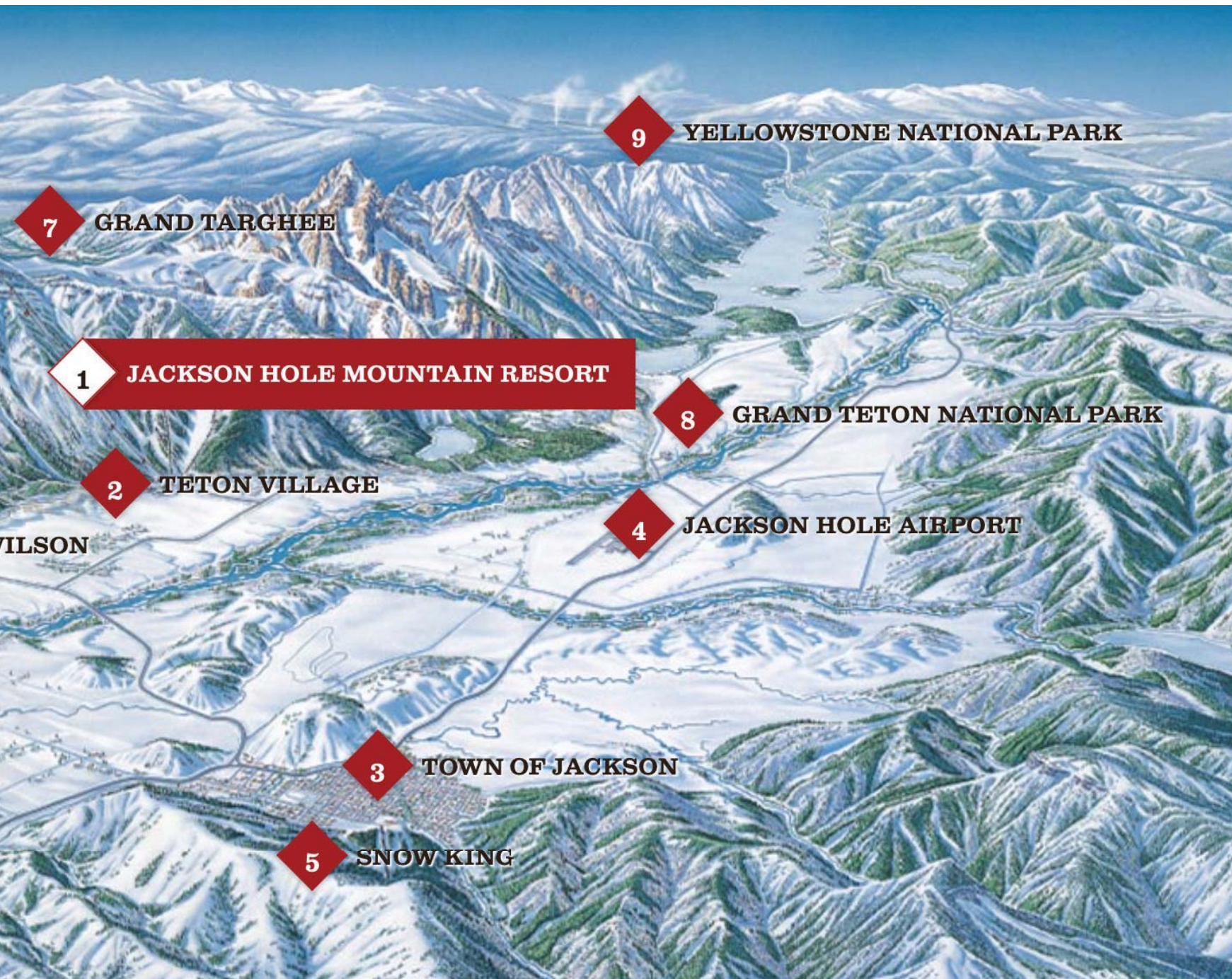
**THE GRAND TETON IS THE REGION'S

Our double-revealed lift runs a length of 4.5 miles with a vertical rise of 4,000 feet.

Jackson Hole Mountain Resort averages 459" of snowfall annually.



TETON COUNTY SEARCH & RESCUE (TCSAR)

Was started in 1980 by the Teton County Sheriff's Department to provide emergency search and rescue services for Teton and surrounding areas in need.

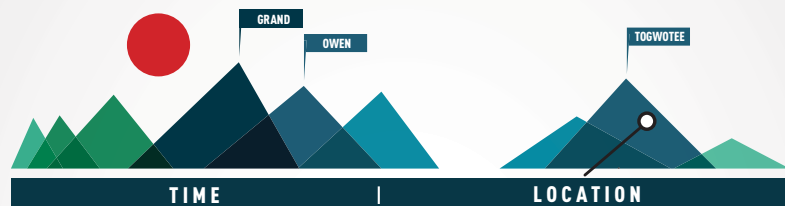

At 5:23pm, TCSO SAR Board was paged regarding a man that hiked High School Butte and may require assistance getting down. The Board decided to advise SAR Team to respond. At 5:31pm, Board received a second page that the hiker made it down safely. The incident was stood down.

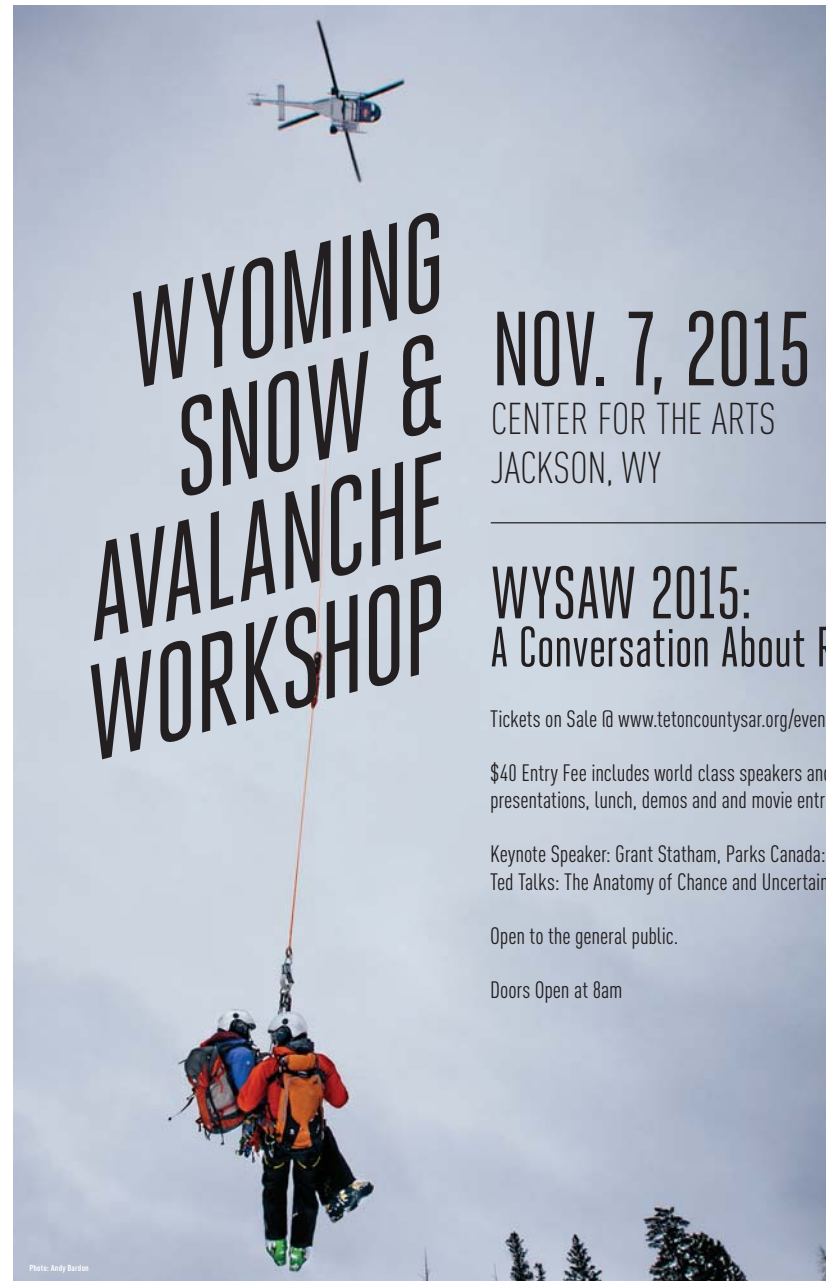
