



Effective teamwork makes almost anything possible



Cumbria second largest county in England and second most sparsely populated.


Approx 120km north to south and 90km east to west, 6768 square km.

Most of Cumbria is upland or mountanous, includes Lake District, and part of Yorkshire Dales National Parks also the North Pennines 'Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty'.

Very popular tourist destination with nearly 20 million 'day' visits per year.

All the usual mountain and water related activities.

There are 12 teams - 10 Mountain Rescue Teams, a Mines Rescue Team and Mountain Rescue Search Dogs covering the whole of Cumbria.



- •There are approx. 450 people in the 12 teams.
- They respond to around 600 incidents each year.
- •15 to 30 fatalities.

The 12 teams have a very strong regional association, Lake District Search and Mountain Rescue Association (LDSAMRA)

- •They are included in the County Major Incident Plans and are represented at County resilience forums.
- •They are regarded as category 1 responders along with Police, Fire, Ambulance etc.

999 call requesting Cumbria Police.

Lady reporting her husband, 51, has not returned home from a trip to the mountains. (Local person) Mobile goes direct to Voice Mail

Left the house at 07:00 probably heading for Helvellyn.

Stated he would be back by 18:00

Caller not sure of route or start point



Keswick MRT called out by Cumbria Police via Sarcall.



Weather

65 to 90Kph Westerly over summits.

Cloudbase 400 to 600metres.

Some light snow at times.

-5C at 900 metres. Full winter conditions over 600metres.

Large cornices over eastern faces and some indications of avalanche activity especially on east aspect slopes.

Lake District Mountain Rescue Search Dogs Called Out via Sarcall.




Routes and areas for Teams and Dogs allocated and personnel being deployed as available.

Request for SAR helicopter support placed with Police FIM (Force Incident Manager) who contacts NMOC (National Maritime Operations Centre) to request helicopter.

22:15

Rescue 199 allocated to this incident. Keswick MRT now speak with NMOC with information re the tasking and give update of weather in the area. Rescue 199 ETA is 23:05



Rescue 199 lands at Keswick base, delayed by worsening weather. Search areas currently not possible due to winds and visibility.

00:20

Rescue 199 has to return to Prestwick as weather now precludes any searching or deploying MRT members by aircraft.



Search well underway, all initial assets deployed.

Keswick and Patterdale MRTs decide to start calling more MRTs to form a second wave of searchers ready to be on the hill at approx. 05:00

00:35

Further MRTs called out are; Penrith MRT Kirkby Stephen MRT Kendal MRT



Also put on stand by are groups from Keswick MRT and Langdale Ambleside MRT with further AutoPulses and spare batteries ready to deploy if cas is found and deeply hypothermic.

00:45


LDSAMRA (Lake District Search and Mountain Rescue Association) Silver group alerted to possible major search requirement for next 24 hours and need to maintain 'normal' MRT cover across the Lake District.






Search Dog handler and Keswick TM at Summit.







All dog handlers and hill parties tasked to Cassite.

Penrith MRT now requested to attend immediately to assist if casualty has to be carried off the hill

Keswick Mobile with Autopulse arrives at Greenside roadhead.

02:01

Cas update, Temp 22C from armpit, head, abdominal and pelvic injuries GCS 6.



Rescue 936 still having difficulty due to weather.



Rescue 936 can not land or winch from anywhere near cas location due to wind and visibility.

03:34

Langdale Ambleside MRT contacted to send AutoPulse Batteries in addition to those already on the hill.

03:38

RVS (Royal Volunteer Service) contacted to ask if food etc. can be made available to rescuers when they get off the hill.

Cas stretcher party now on the move again, cas being bagged, AutoPulse working well.





- 2 Dog finds and 3 dog and handler locates
- 2 Fatalities, (1 fell (mountain) runner, 1 despondant)
