
JACKSON HOLE ENCOMPASSES GRAND TETON NATIONAL PARK (EST. 1929) AND IS JUST SOUTH **OF YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK (EST. 1872).** OVER 3,000,000 VISITORS FROM ALL OVER THE **WORLD IN THE SUMMERS. WINTER VISITATION** IS ALSO HIGH, BUT NOT AS EXTREME, AS WE **AVERAGE AROUND 500,000 VISITORS.**



HIGHEST PEAK AT 13,766 FEET ABOVE SEA LEVEL

Offering over 2500 acres of the best skiing and riding in North America. The Resort is owned and operated as a special use permitee of Bridger Teton National Forest. Summer and Winter operations include the aerial tram and other lift access activities including biking, hiking, skiing, snowboarding and paragliding.

Our double-reversible tram runs a length of 12,463' with a vertical rise of 4,139

Jackson Hole Mountain Resort averages 459" of snow per year.



TETON COUNTY SEARCH & RESCUE (TCSAR)

Together, we create an organization that works to keep Teton County residents and visitors safe in the backcountry 24 hours a day --7 days a week.






