= nodecan be an individual, family, organization, corporation/society, government, etc.


 tie is the connection, based on common values, interests, likes, dislikes, trade, etc.

search area 342.000 km²

virtual community used Google Earth and Amazon's "Mechanical Turk"

search area 342.000km²

- Google Earth created 100m wide search sectors
- Amazon's Mechanical Turk provided the Internet venue for people to sign up to help
- 3000+ people helped search by viewing satellite imagery



Does it work?

search area 16.000 km²



- went missing on 2 Dec. 2007
- search area 260 km², 40+ major avalanches
- formal and large search effort suspended 8 Dec. 2007




3 snowboarders – Nashington state

- formal search to resume in July 2008
- mid June 2008 members of www.turnall-year.com organize search effort
- coordinate with law enforcement and ski patrol
- conduct search and find buried bivouac with 3 bodies



climber killed – Colorado

group called friend immediately after accident



- friend posted report on Internet with subject's name
- rescue team and police inundated with telephone

calls – delayed response
